

## **Notice of Confirmation of Public Path Order**

## Town and Country Planning Act 1990, Section 257 and Paragraph 7 of Schedule 14

## West Suffolk Council (Wickhambrook Footpath No 10(part)) Public Path Diversion Order 2024

On 16 August 2024 West Suffolk Council confirmed the above order made under Section 257 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

The effect of the order as confirmed is to divert the entire width of that part of Wickhambrook Public Footpath No 10 commencing at Ordnance Survey grid reference (OSGR) TL77645476 and proceeding in a north easterly direction for approximately 108 metres to OSGR TL77715484 then in an east south easterly direction for approximately 113 metres to OSGR TL77825481 to a new line running between the aforementioned grid references in an east south easterly direction for approximately 102 metres then in an east north easterly direction for approximately 70 metres then in a north easterly direction for approximately 50 metres as described in the order and as shown on the order map.

The order comes into force on the date on which West Suffolk Council certifies that the alternative highway has been created to its reasonable satisfaction, but if any person aggrieved by the order desires to question its validity or that of any provision contained in it on the ground that it is not within the powers of the above act, or on the ground that any requirement of that act, or any regulation made under it has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the order he or she may apply to the High Court for any of these purposes under Section 287 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 within six weeks from the date on which notice is first published as required by paragraph 7 of Schedule 14 to that act.
