

Notice of Public Path Order

Town and Country Planning Act 1990, Section 257 and Paragraph 1 of Schedule 14

West Suffolk Council (Wickhambrook Footpath Number 10 (part)) Public Path Diversion Order 2024

The above order, made on 13 June 2024 under section 257 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, will divert the entire width of that part of Wickhambrook Public Footpath Number 10 commencing at Ordnance Survey grid reference (OSGR) TL77645476 and proceeding in a north easterly direction for approximately 108 metres to OSGR TL77715484 then in an east south easterly direction for approximately 113 metres to OSGR TL77825481 to a new line running between the aforementioned grid references in an east south easterly direction for approximately 102 metres then in an east north easterly direction for approximately 70 metres then in a north easterly direction for approximately 50 metres as described in the order and as shown on the order map.
